## **A message from the Superintendent**

**Dear friends,**

*How can we sing the songs of the Lord while in a foreign land?*

That was the cry of God's people during the Babylonian exile, when their home and everything they knew had been swept from under their feet, when they found themselves in a new and strange place – how can we sing the Lord's song here!? Its overly dramatic to say that we are in the same kind of place, but it certainly feels a little bit that way! Many of us had our days and weeks punctuated by church – worshipping and serving together. The places we had met week by week – sometimes for many years – are not available to us for now. When we come to sing a hymn, we are not met with the voices of the brothers and sisters we journey with week by week. In all this, can we sing the Lord's song?

Yes we can!

Many of you will have noticed that Facebook and YouTube are filled with ministers of all denominations recording themselves offering prayers and words of hope. This hasn't always gone well, one set his sleeve on fire, another activated filters which gave him rabbit ears for the Mass he was celebrating! It isn't easy and we are learning all the time, so why are we doing it? It's not simply because we think you will miss our sermons so much that we have make sure you have them! It's not because we desperately want to appear in your living room Sunday by Sunday! We do it because we want to find new ways of singing the Lord's song and fulfilling our calling.

We can all find ways of singing the Lord's song in these times, because the Lord's song is not just about turning up on a Sunday! The Lord's song is about faith, hope, and love – and each of us can hold onto those things and live in their light. How?
