A message from the Superintendent

Dear friends,

I cut it. I know you will have been very concerned all week about my hair, well I cut it. I think it looks ok – from the front anyway, I can't see the back so I will have to make sure no one else does either. I will make sure I only allow people to see my best side!

We are often told to keep a “stiff upper lip”, not to let people see weakness or fragility – to let people see our “best side” and I am sure that is not healthy for us! Sometimes we allow that kind of thinking to invade the life of faith – some say we should never question God, never be angry with God, and never acknowledge our struggles with faith. Of course, I'm sure you know this isn't the way to a healthy faith! Think about the resurrection appearances, at the heart of them all Jesus disciples are honest with him! Mary weeps at the tomb, begs to be told what is going on and Jesus speaks her name. Thomas says he won't believe until he sees for himself and Jesus holds out his wounded hands to him. Peter says “I'm going fishing” when he doesn't know what else to do after his denial, and Jesus meets him on the beach, forgives and restores him. The two on the Emmaus road share all their disappointment and grief and Jesus sits and breaks bread with them. Jesus doesn't expect them to present their best side rather he comes to them, walks with them, sits with them, eats with them, and shows them his love. He will do the same for us too.

Micah 6 verse 8 “what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God”. Walking humbly means being honest with God - about our struggles, our doubts, our fears and letting him minister his grace to us. So let's do justice, let's love kindness, but especially at this time in our world let's walk humbly and honestly with our God who loves us, who will not leave us, and we will find our way.


