A message from the Superintendent

Dear Friends,

While I have lived in Macclesfield, I have tried to grow fruit and vegetables in the garden. Some years have been better than others, but I have been successful with tomatoes, oddly shaped carrots, courgettes, rhubarb, and even the occasional strawberry. When I was in my previous appointment in West Yorkshire, I was less successful overall, but I did manage to grow some potatoes.





One year, I planted them, I watered them, I waited until the green shoots appeared, and I continued to care for

them until the plants were grown. When the right time came, I dug around the plant, and found lots and lots of potatoes. They were duly cooked and eaten and they were, of course, delicious. There were more potatoes left in the ground, and they may well remain there to

this very day. You see, I kept telling myself to get out there and dig them up, knowing that when cooked they would be lovely, but I never managed to get around to it, and then I moved away from that manse – leaving those treasures buried in the earth!

I wonder if we can sometimes treat God a little bit like buried potatoes. We know that being close to God would be a wonderful thing, but we never quite get around to unearthing the treasures of God's grace that



are offered to us. We have had a bit, we have had a taste, but we forget that there is more than we could ever imagine waiting for us. The problem is, of course, that unearthing anything – potatoes or the riches of God's grace – takes a bit of work!




We are fast approaching Easter, we will remember the remarkable story, we may break open a chocolate egg and devour its contents, we will sing the great hymns and gaze at the glory of the resurrection, and we will wonder at the God who defeats death to offer us life. But the truth is that before we know it, Easter will have come and gone for another year - and then, perhaps, everything goes back to normal.

The heart of Easter calls us to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, to see the horror of the cross but to know he did not stay in the tomb dead, but that he was raised to life. Through his resurrection we are offered new life, and a glorious relationship with God. Easter gives us an assurance that we are loved by the God who created all things, loved so much that He would send his Son to die for us., so that we might catch a glimpse of the depth of Gods love. And yet it is easy to forget that there is more for us to find in this great mystery, too easy to go through the motions and not dig into Easter to find the treasure waiting to be unearthed.

St Augustine wrote: "the joyful news that He is Risen does not change the

contemporary world. Still before us lie work, discipline, sacrifice. But the fact of Easter gives us the spiritual power to do the work, accept the discipline and make the sacrifice."

The glory of Easter enables us to fulfil our calling as disciples of Christ, to do the work that we are called – but in doing that, by the grace of God we find the riches of God, and a new vision of God's love for us.



In his book *The Hidden Resurrection*, Henri Nouwen, reflecting on the first Easter writes: "To the women and

men who had committed themselves to him, he revealed that his mission had been fulfilled. To those who shared in his ministry, he gave the sacred task to call all people into the new life with him." That same task is given to us – to hold out the grace and love of God to all the world.

As we travel through Easter this year, let us dig deeply, in the scriptures, in hymns, in prayer and meditation – in all that we do, for a word, a moment, an image, or whatever it might be for each of us, that opens our eyes to God again. Let us live in this new life which He has brought us, let us grow closer to him and know his love and his presence. Whatever you do, do not simply wander through Easter – let us dig, and dig deeply that we might unearth the unimaginable riches of the living, death defeating, world transforming God!

Were the whole realm of nature mine, that were an offering far too small; love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all!

Dementia Cafe

Two years ago, church council at Broken Cross accepted a proposal to open a dementia cafe/club as a community resource and as part of our church's mission towards vulnerable people in the Macclesfield area. At that church meeting 12 members of our congregation volunteered to help establish and run the club. However, the volunteers themselves asked if some form of training could be provided so they had a "working understanding" of dementia. After a bit of searching, we partnered with East Cheshire Hospice where we all undertook a 3 hour trading session on Dementia Awareness, an excellent and informative course.

Prior to us opening, I also visited three other clubs (Tytherington, Poynton and Wilmslow) to introduce ourselves and to take advice on how they operated. We have maintained contact with Tytherington and Poynton since.

So, in June 2022, we opened our doors for the first time to the ABCD (A Broken Cross Dementia) Club. We meet on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month from 1.30pm to 3.30pm. We employ a Session Leader, Julia, who leads the first half, with reminiscence therapy, movement and music, armchair exercises, dance, games, quizzes and picture bingo. The second half we enjoy tea/coffee and cake. This gives carers and volunteers the chance to talk, network, swap experiences, and has proved especially valuable to the carers.

We are funded by our church, we make no charge, but we have received donations and bequests since we opened, and a grant from Macclesfield Town Council. We currently have 8 or 9 couples, and the same number of volunteers, attending each session and are receiving new enquiries each week.

I am happy to report that Prestbury Methodist Church has now opened a similar cafe/club at their church. They meet on the first Wednesday of each month, from 1.30pm to 3.30pm, and we are very glad to welcome their contribution to help in what is a growing area of need.

No referrals are required to attend either club, we run on a drop-in basis. For further information contact John on 07915252535.

Church weekend away (organised by Prestbury Methodist/Heather Cann) 1st – 3rd March 2024 at the Thornleigh Christian Hotel, Grange over Sands.

This was an extremely successful weekend, filled with fun, fellowship and, of course, food, and a great encouragement to us all as we explored in faith the deeper meanings and unanswered questions in a couple of well-known Bible passages. The theme of the weekend was "Living Water" and the first Bible passage which we studied was from John Chapter 4 about Jesus meeting the Samaritan woman at the well (led by Rev. Ros). We do not know the woman's name, her age or whether she had any children, but she became the first female evangelist as she told many other Samaritans in her town that Jesus told her everything she ever did, and the others also believed in Jesus, now knowing that He was the Saviour of the world.

On the Saturday session just before the evening meal Rev. Graham shared insights into the passage from Exodus Chapter 17 where God told Moses to strike the rock, so that water would come out of it for the thirsty Israelites to drink.

On the Friday evening after the meal, we shared pictures of water, still or flowing as in a river, which we had brought along with us, and we had dingbats and a quiz, to which the answers were all water-related. At the end of both evenings we shared "Examen", a meditation for close of day from Lectio 365 relating to that particular evening.

I was fortunate to stay in the same very comfortable room which I had the previous year, albeit in the "Hideaway" at the back of the main hotel building, thus braving the rain on several occasions on the way to the hotel lounge! The Friday and Saturday afternoons were quite wet, although I managed to fit in a walk along the promenade at Arnside (one train stop away from Grange) between showers.

We had the best weather on the Sunday, when most of us managed to fit in at least one walk in Grange before our communion service led by our ministers. I was fortunate to have a short walk along the prom before breakfast on the Saturday while the weather was still dry.

The Saturday entertainment "Opportunity Knocks" was hilarious and well received by the audience! It included songs, magic tricks from Rev. Graham, jokes, stand-up comedy, poems, a brilliant rendition of "There's a hole in my bucket" by Heather and Jo from Prestbury and 2 great songs from Peter Jones (Broken Cross) accompanied by him on guitar and harmonica. I joined 3 men from Prestbury (Roger, Geoff and Rob) in a barbershop quartet number.

Altogether a most enjoyable and uplifting weekend. Many thanks to all who organised and took part in it, and in all 5 churches in our Circuit were represented.

The Gift of Love


Sweetest word in all creation precious gift from heaven above richest source of inspiration is the perfect gift of love


Knitted Bible Exhibition at Macclesfield Methodist Church Part 2!
