As we embark upon a new year with our Family Church – Methodist Families Together, we are delighted to reflect on the blessings of our recent summer holiday club. This year's programme was another great success, and we would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to all our incredible volunteers. Your dedication and enthusiasm are the very foundation of what we do – without your commitment, our summer holiday club simply could not happen.

Kingdom Builders Holiday Club

Once again, Macclesfield Methodist Church was transformed into a vibrant kingdom for our Kingdom Builders holiday club, inspired by Minecraft and Lego. The children were enthralled by our larger-than-life Alex and Steve characters – if you're not familiar, do ask a child to fill you in! Over three lively days, our Master Builders, Graham and Angela, led sessions focusing on the theme of building God's kingdom together.





Each morning, the church the church buzzed with anticipation as children arrive, many eager enough to come early each day! Upon arrival, they were given a warm welcome and directed into their Kingdom groups, the 'Block Builders' and 'Pixel Pioneers'. Every day began with a special activity to spark their creativity and set the tone for the day ahead.

On the first day, the children got stuck in by designing their own avatar masks,

immersing themselves in the theme and preparing for their building adventures. Day two saw them challenged to construct model temples using a variety of building materials, showcasing their remarkable creativity and teamwork. On the third day, the children's imagination was put to the test as they worked collaboratively in teams to



create impressive structures using spaghetti and marshmallows. Each activity encouraged collaboration and imagination, ensuring everyone was ready for a fulfilling day of creative construction and learning.

We began each day gathered as one, introducing our daily theme. Graham and Angela explained to the children that we are all called to be Kingdom Builders – God invites us to join Him in building His kingdom. As creative beings, made in God's image, we celebrated our talents through fun activities, uplifting songs, and prayer. Afterwards, the children explored a variety of activities in their groups before coming together for food, drinks, and fellowship.

After lunch, we reunited to reflect on the day's learning 'IRL' (in real life), sharing insights and experiences. We closed each day with a prayer activity, writing or drawing prayers on bricks, which were then assembled into a wall, symbolising our collective prayers and hopes.



Day One: We explored Genesis 1:26-28, learning about God as the ultimate Kingdom Builder. We discussed how we are made in His image and entrusted to care for the world He lovingly created,

emphasising our responsibility to build a better world.

Day Two: The focus shifted to Solomon's construction of the Temple (1 Kings 6:11-13; 8:10-13). We reflected on God's closeness and presence among His people, teamwork, and the importance of sharing God's love with others.

Day Three: We delved into Jesus' parable of the wise and foolish builders (Matthew 7:24-27; Luke 6:46-49), considering what it means to build our lives on a strong

foundation – Jesus and His teachings – for true joy, hope, and resilience through life's storms.



The holiday club was a true joy for all involved. Our heartfelt thanks go out to everyone who contributed – from organisers and team leaders, to the countless volunteers, especially those in the kitchen keeping us refreshed, the packing-up crew,



and those who spent hours preparing resources in advance. Your generosity and hard work made this event possible and memorable for everyone.

Our schedule is full of events as we approach Christmas and continue afterwards. October, in


particular, is a very hectic month.

Members' voice....

What is Action for Children?

It is a national charity which has its origin in Methodism – in 1869 a Methodist minister, Rev Dr Thomas Bowman, when visiting London was very disturbed and unhappy when he saw children sheltering and sleeping under the railway arches near Waterloo station. Soon after that his ministry brought him to London and, as part of his ministry, he sought to do something to help such children. In 1871 he brought 2 boys into their home which soon increased until the need to house many more, became evident and soon, 'Methodist Children's Homes' were opened all over the country in order to provide safety and care for vulnerable children. Initially they were just 'Homes' but some then also sought to provide education – there was one in Congleton – called Danesford.

Does anyone remember 'Sunny Smiles'?

Once a year, children in Methodist Sunday schools were encouraged to sell photographs of smiling children who all lived in one of the homes – a penny a picture – in old money! We all competed to see how many we could sell!

As the years passed society changed and, quite rightly, the emphasis changed from the need to provide homes to the need to offer support for children and families in their own environment. This meant the name should change to reflect that – so in 2008 the old MCH charity was retitled to be called – Action for Children (AfC) – a dynamic title with emphasis on 'action'. (see the website for more information.)

There is an excellent team working at the centre but they are also supported by nationwide teams of volunteers. For us locally it includes all those who have boxes, those who run coffee mornings and those who are the AfC secretaries in each of our churches.

Until very recently Steve Oliver was the district representative for the Greater Manchester area but the new District covering the whole of the Northwest means that he no longer has a role. Hopefully we will soon find out who has taken on that role for our area. We will miss Steve's enthusiasm and hard work for AfC. He used to persuade us to rattle AfC boxes on Macclesfield station – on one occasion it was a bitter cold December morning! It was heartwarming to enjoy the generous giving by such a range of travellers – including school children out on a school journey on one occasion.

Many years ago, when I was the secretary at a church in Stockport, we were invited to visit a family centre in Wythenshawe where AfC worked with families and children who needed support. I was reminded of this when I read 'Sam's Story' in this year's AfC service booklet. It told the story of, not just Sam but also his mother and siblings. Despite the fact that so many of us live in reasonable comfort there as still too many stories of children and families in crisis.

Almost by default I have just taken on the role of Circuit AfC Secretary so I look forward to working with the AfC secretaries in each of our churches so that we can be proactive on behalf of all those in need of support.

Grateful thanks must go out to everyone who supports this very worthwhile charity.



The butterfly image represents aspects of Christian belief, such as:

- **The egg:** Symbolizes new life offered by Jesus to all who believe in him (John 3: 1-8).
- **The caterpillar:** Represents growth as disciples through feeding on the Word of God (2 Timothy 3: 15-17).
- The chrysalis: Signifies prayer as the powerhouse for Christians (Ephesians 3: 16).
- **The butterfly:** A symbol of resurrection, new life in Christ, freedom, and perfection (2 Corinthians 5: 17).

This symbol also aligns with the MWIB project "The Butterfly Project," which aims to end violence against women wherever it occurs, inspired by the Mirabel Sisters who were murdered by a Dominican dictator. The YouTube film "Code Name Butterfly" is recommended for viewing.

Women's rights activists have observed 25 November as a day against gender-based violence since 1981

There is a peaceful walk to support this in Manchester on November 25th for details see Ruth Gunning (Macclesfield) all are welcome

Just for fun - Wordsearch

For Britain, the First World War began on 4th August 1914 and ended on 11th November 1918. At the start, the British Government asked for 100,000 volunteers to join the Army. 750,000 applied in the very first month. An estimated 250,000 British boys lied about their age in order to join up. The youngest caught was just 12 - he was sent home. Average life expectancy in the trenches was just six weeks. In all, 65 million men from 30 countries fought in the First World War. More than nine million fighting men were killed during the conflict, a third of them through disease. At least 750,000 of these were British. The Victoria Cross, the highest military award, was awarded 628 times in the First World War.
